Q: "Is a non-EU citizen legally entitled to healthcare in Italy even if they don't have a proper permit?

A: Article 35 of Italy's Law on Immigration deals specifically with healthcare for foreigners in Italy who lack the required papers.

Under these rules public hospitals and licensed clinics provide outpatient care, urgent/essential treatment as well as longer term hospitalisation to all patients under all circumstances, as well as offering free medical counselling and preventive medical care.

The following services are guaranteed:

- a) social support for pregnancy and maternity, equal to that provided to Italians;
- b) healthcare of minors:
- c) vaccinations both required by law and within the framework of preventative campaigns sanctioned by Region authorities;
- d) international prophylactic treatment;
- e) prevention, diagnosis and treatment of infectious diseases and possible reclamation of breeding grounds

Foreigners entering the country illegally and without papers are provided with a special permit known as the 'STP permit' (i.e. 'Straniero Temporaneamente Presente', meaning 'foreign national in transit'), which covers for essential emergency treatment. A declaration of poverty is attached to the STP as proof of the holder's lack of means to meet the expense of treatment.
